

Trevor Howard-Hill died on 1 June 2011, aged 77. He was born in New Zealand, where he completed both a Ph.D. and a library degree. Having served as head of cataloguing for the Alexander Turnbull Library, in 1964 he moved to the U.K. to become librarian for the Shakespeare Institute. In 1965 he was appointed research fellow in library computing at Oxford, and in 1970 he moved to University College, Swansea. In 1971 he completed a second doctoral thesis on Ralph Crane. During these years he also produced the thirty-seven volume series of Oxford Shakespeare Concordances, and he conceived of the *Index to British Literary Bibliography*. The first volume of the *Index* appeared in 1969; the last two volumes, on *The British Book Trade 1475-1890*, were published in 2009.

In 1972 he moved to the University of South Carolina, where he would be named C. Wallace Martin Professor of English. He edited *The Tragedy of Sir John van Olden Barnavelt* and co-edited Middleton's *A Game at Chess* (both for the Malone Society). He compiled a guide to *British Book Trade Dissertations to 1980* (1998) and edited the *Papers of the Bibliographical Society of America*. He received NEH and Guggenheim Fellowships. Mr. Howard-Hill wrote a paper for the 2011 World Shakespeare Congress in Prague, which was read in his absence.
