New Place holds a particularly important position among the landmarks of Shakespeare's life. At the age of 33, Shakespeare purchased the largest home in Stratford-upon-Avon and lived there until his death 19 years later in 1616. During these years, he wrote some of his greatest works, including *The Tempest*, *Hamlet* and *Macbeth*.

New Place was demolished in the 18th century, making it difficult for visitors to get a real sense of the site's significance and history.

Now, in celebration of the 400th anniversary of Shakespeare's death, the Shakespeare Birthplace Trust has an exciting and innovative $\mathfrak{L}5.25m$ plan to transform the site of New Place into a fitting tribute to our greatest dramatist.

The imposing new entrance gateway is in the same place as Shakespeare's front door, enabling visitors to walk in his footsteps. Bronze strips laid in the ground outline the shape of the house, emphasizing its size and splendour.

Throughout the grounds, specially commissioned artworks will symbolize different aspects of Shakespeare's life and times, and represent his plays and sonnets.

A new exhibition centre will be constructed, providing the opportunity to exhibit treasures from the Shakespeare Birthplace Trust collection which have never been on display before. Attractive new displays will inform and educate visitors, and additional learning spaces will be included. At the same time, significant conservation work will be carried out on neighbouring Nash's House, the home of Shakespeare's granddaughter.
