- 5) **1 March 2018** Please provide brief responses (about a page) to the other members of your group; these should also be uploaded to dropbox.
- 6) **28 March 2018** SAA begins (we will not know the time and date of our seminar until after 1 December).

We'd like each member of the group to write a brief constructive response (no more than a page or 250 words) to the other group members, copied to us. Please send these on no later than 20 March (this is later than the original deadline announced in our first email).
